Classification review announced for the film Split

The Classification Review Board has received an application to review the classification of the film *Split*.

Split was classified M with the consumer advice 'Mature themes, violence and coarse language' by the Classification Board on 8 December 2016.

The Classification Review Board will meet on 25 January 2017 to consider the application. The decision and reasons will later be published on www.classification.gov.au.

If an individual or organisation wishes to apply for standing as an interested party to this review, please write to the Convenor of the Review Board. The names of interested parties will be disclosed in the Review Board's final decision report, unless requested otherwise.

The closing date to lodge your application for standing as an interested party and any submissions is 24 January 2017. Please note that the Review Board can only consider submissions about *Split* itself and not any other matters relating to film classification policy or issues generally.
